The Faculty of Law, University of Belgrade and UNODC reached an agreement to jointly hold a course on anti-corruption as developed by UNODC within the framework of the Master in European Integration.

The course was held on the premises of the Faculty of Law in Belgrade and was attended on a voluntary basis by 14 students participants in the Master in European Integration and additional 10 to 15 students

from the Diplomatic Forum. The student body was a mix of Serbian and international participants. The course was held in English. The instructor for the course was Dr. Ugljesa Ugi



Zvekic.

The Course Syllabus was developed on the basis of UNODC course design but was reduced to 10 modules. The teaching material was composed of the reading material from the Course Syllabus and a series of power point presentations for each module, which were made available to the participants.

The presentations were held on Tuesdays and Fridays from 6 to 8 pm. It consisted of 10 hours and was well attended. The main didactical component consisted in instructor's power-point presentations per each module and short time made available for comments and questions. Towards the end of the course the participants were requested to provide group discussion regarding:

- 1. The alignment of the Serbian anti-corruption legislation with UNCAC provisions, and
- 2. Efforts needed to strengthen the effectiveness of international anti-corruption cooperation.



A the closure of the course the participants from the Master in European Integration were presented with a certificate jointly issued by the Faculty of Law, Belgrade and UNODC (Dean, Professor Sima Avramovic, Faculty of Law, and Director John Sandage, Division of Treaty Affairs, UNODC).
